Warsaw, 16 - 17 December 2019

POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews, Anne Frank House and Kazerne Dossin would like to cordially invite you to attend the HHEINA ‘No Difference, big Difference’ seminar in Warsaw on 16-17 December 2019.

The three museums are working closely together to develop tools and practices to prevent and combat intolerance of „others” - especially Jews, Muslims and Roma - and to strengthen two groups of professionals, teachers and police, who witness discrimination in their work field.

The seminar will focus on presenting and discussing pedagogical tools for teachers and police officers in the field of discrimination issues, prejudices, polarization, hate crimes. The catalogue of good practices for museums and cultural institutions that engage in anti-discrimination education will also be presented.

The overall aim of the seminar is to connect, link and share existing good practices and experiences of teachers and police officers of the three countries.

Another goal will also be to reflect on the circumstances to initiate and develop new materials as an answer to new needs of the target groups and how we can continue to work together and continue to learn from each other.
